I met the volunteer approximately three years ago when she was a foster/volunteer with an animal non-profit.. My first meeting with her resulted in her being dishonest with xxxxx, founder of the non-profit. At that point, I felt like she was manipulative, dishonest, and ruthless. Because of that one incident, I resolved to disassociate myself from her. I spoke with both the director at that time, xxxxx and the non-profit founder and informed them that I would prefer to have as little dealings with her as possible. When she became a volunteer rescue coordinator for Fairfield County animal shelter. I again made it known that I would be as professional as possible but my dealings with her would be strictly animal related. Without verbally having a conversation, it was apparent that neither she nor I cared for each other nor did we trust each other. Unfortunately, because of this anything I would have to say about her would be considered hearsay as we never had direct conversations without it being related to the animals being reserved or leaving. I did witness her, and unfortunately there was many occasions, but I don't have dates when she would interject herself into situations that were not suitable for a volunteer to be a part of such as trying to tell the staff members what to do and what not to do and when to do it. I never actually witnessed these activities other than over hearing conversations when she would come in almost in a bragging way, telling the current director and/or managers what she had done. I even ask director xxxxx in front of the manager at that time how much authority a volunteer had over a staff member. His response was none as volunteers were not over any staff members. Unfortunately, the director and I had started a conversation, but did not have the opportunity to finish it before my retirement. This is all the information that I can really offer as in the past three years I never once waivered about my feelings for the volunteer however I was a little biased about my feelings based on my first dealings with her.

**Below are notes taken from verbal conversations: These notes were taken directly from those conversations.**

(Former volunteer) called and indicated that the reason she quit was because of the lies and mistruths being spread about her by volunteer.

(Staff member) Indicated that the first time she met the volunteer she introduced herself to staff member as “The B\*tch”. Told staff member that the manager and an inmate were “caught in an inappropriate relationship”. Wondered why a volunteer would tell a staff member that?

(Staff member) Said the volunteer told her that the only reason we use our veterinarian is because they were caught in a sexual relationship with female inmates. (We haven’t used female inmates at the shelter in years)

(Staff member) said she witnessed the volunteer trying to get an inmate to make a confession about the dog fight, but inmate refused – saying he would not confess to something that he didn’t do. Definitely an inappropriate role for a volunteer to take – interrogating an inmate.

(Staff member) Volunteer had gone into the shelter management system and made herself “super user” without knowledge of shelter manager – had removed posting privileges from staff without manager approval. Appeared to have logged into the system after operational hours to indicate that a medical check on a dog had been made, but a time was listed for when the shelter was not open. Also saw her verbally talking down to volunteers who were there to set up the animal play yard. They left and never returned.

(Staff member) Said that at the Carolinas Unite conference on March 10-12 a volunteer from another county told her that she and members of important animal welfare groups were told by the volunteer that the manager did not have the background to run the shelter and should have never been hired in an effort to discredit the manager.
